CHATTING WITH DARLA JONES, EDUCATOR CONFERENCE DIRECTOR

I got a chance to visit with Darla Jones about the upcoming Educator Conference and some of her favorite things about Texas Thespians. ~ BK Goodman

BKG: Darla, tell us about how you got involved in Texas Thespians.

DJ: I chartered Troupe 6391 at Fort Worth Academy of Fine Arts in 2005 (we were at Wichita Falls that year), and began to see a need for clarity and communication with the directors. As a first-time director, it was overwhelming - even in those days when there were just 2500 or so people! So, I volunteered to rewrite the director's packet so that first-timers like me would have a clue as to what was happening at Festival. After that, I started the Junior Festival in Houston, then moved onto helping with State Festival scheduling, managing Guidebook, maintaining the website, and in recent years, heading the Educator Conference and heading up the Educator Collective Board. I'm a big believer that if you see a need, see how you can fill it and get involved!

BKG: You're also the Board Secretary for Texas Thespians. What does the Secretary do?

DJ: Well, the official job of a secretary is to take minutes of meetings and write correspondence. I have also co-written and edited bylaws, the manual of operations, and any official documents and publications - like this newsletter. I love writing finding just the right words, using the correct grammar, the correct spelling and researching the origin of words - all of the nerdy things that go with writing! Haha!

BKG: What's different about the Educator Conference than others that you've attended?

DJ: For one, we rotate presenters and guest artists. When I was first given this position, I was determined that we wouldn't see the same workshops year after year.

BKG: Why is that?

DJ: It is so important to me that teachers are inspired when they leave TTEC, and that they feel like they have new tools to take back to their classrooms. Every theatre teacher needs to keep up with the latest information for technology or new scripts or products, so we can keep ahead of our students! So we look for guest artists who bring new material and a fresh face! Blake Minor does a great job of securing our guest artists and bringing a variety of topics.

BKG: Talk to me about Thespian Bucks!

DJ: Thespian Bucks are the <u>best!</u> Amy (Jordan) came up with the idea a few years ago, and we first used them in a cash cube, which was a BLAST! We give them for years of service, workshop attendance, or random drawings, and then our



educators can use them towards event fees. It's just a great way for us to give back to our teachers. Some people have really racked up the bucks and gotten their registrations covered!

BKG: Are there other ways that teachers can get free registration?

DJ: We have teacher grants - Send a Teacher - that we offer each year, and if a teacher presents 3 workshops for a conference, their registration is covered for that event. This year, Theatrefolk offered eight scholarships to cover registration to TTEC, which is AWESOME!! I love that we make it so accessible for anyone to attend. Truly, that's the spirit of Texas Thespians - that generosity and inclusion. And ultimately, our goal is to make our teachers better so our students can be their best.

BKG: What's new this year for TTEC?

DJ: Design and Tech Challenges - just like at Texas Thespian Festival! We decided we would give the teachers the opportunity to compete just like our students. It's going to be so fun to see what our teachers come up with for set and costume designs, and to compete in tech events.

Also new are our Collaboration Stations. We wanted to have a designated time so people could brainstorm and collaborate with other directors for solutions on working out blocking, or cutting a play for UIL, or share lesson plans, or to figure out how to travel with their students, or any number of the many things that we as directors are faced with. I'm hoping this will offer two things to our teachers - mentorships from veteran teachers, and networking opportunities that they wouldn't normally have.

BKG: What do you do when you're not working on Thespians?

DJ: This marks my 20th year at FWAFA! This year, I'm teaching costuming, stagecraft, and a college transition class. In those 20 years, I've taught 3rd-12th grades and all aspects of theatre. When I'm not teaching, I spend time with my husband John, my 85 year old mom, Mimi, and my two grown children, Blake and Aubrey and son-in-law, Dustin, plus the 2 maniac dogs, Chloe and Daisy. I'm a member of the Woman's Club of Fort Worth, and enjoy seeing long-time friends there. But I absolutely cherish my time working for Texas Thespians and love being a part of our Texas Thespians Board family. It gives me such joy to spend time with people who are so dedicated, so creative and innovative, and who work towards a common goal of serving our educational theatre community in Texas.



Tech Tip Stage Management at a Glance

Got Stage Management?

Many Tech Theatre programs across Texas struggle when it comes to **quality Stage Management** of their shows. Tech students, while amazing, sometimes lack the training to handle the many responsibilities that come with stage managing a large production. Here are some tools you can use to train your stage management students for that **BIG UPCOMING Musical** or **UIL One-Act Play**.



A TALE OF TWO STAGE MANAGERS

Stage Managers have to live a double life during a production. They serve as the "Rehearsal" SM and the "Performance" SM. What does this look like?

Rehearsal SM

- Create a PROMPT BOOK
- Take attendance
- Notate blocking, light cues, sound cues
- Give line notes
- Create and distribute quality rehearsal reports
- Assign other tasks as needed to ASMs

Prompt Books

A PROMPT BOOK is a Stage Manager's BIBLE, and should include:

- the script, with all tech cues notated
- rehearsal reports
 contact sheets
- contact she
 designs
- designs
 publicity
- any other pertinent production documentation

Rehearsal Reports

Rehearsal reports should be created DAILY and include Director's notes, technical notes, production notes, absences, start/stop times, reminders, and what's being covered in today's and tomorrow's rehearsals.

Performance SM

- Help manage Tech Rehearsal(s) with Tech Director
- Call the show
- Manage the run crew
- Effectively communicate with House Manager
- Create and distribute quality performance reports

Calling the Show

Each "CALL" in a show happens in three parts: 1) The 'STANDBY' - about a page before the G-O 2) The 'CUE' - a line or two before the G-O 3) The "G-O" - ON THE CUE LINE/ACTION

So a "CALL" might sound like this: [a page before] "Standby Light Cue 23 and Sound Cue 14." (after dialogue and action gets you closer - a line or two before) "Light Cue 23 and Sound Cue 14..." (as the cue line/action occurs) "GO."
