community.


Lowering Lights and Sound

For people with sensory processing difficulties, loud sounds or flashing lights can be extremely overstimulating and overwhelming. Consider putting on a sensory-friendly performance with dimmer lights, softer sound, and limited flashing/moving light displays.

Labeling Accessible Entrances

Oftentimes, ramps and elevators in schools aren't clearly marked or visible, making it difficult for physically disabled individuals to locate and use these facilities. Posting signage offering directions to these options can make it easier for these audience members to safely make it into your performance space! This also applies to wheelchair/mobility-aid accessible seating options.



While the One Act Play season has been in full swing, another UIL theatre contest just released the State Meet Qualifiers. This contest is none other than the UIL Theatrical Design Contest.

The UIL Theatrical Design Contest has five ways participants can qualify: Makeup/Hair Design, Set Design, Costume Design, Marketing, and Group Design. These designs are based on a play that the entire state of Texas can access. This year, the production was *Hadestown* by Anais Mitchell.

In this competition, students must conjure their interpretation of the play and use it to lead their design process in their respective categories. For example, a student might want to do a Sci-Fi take on *Hadestown*. If they are participating in set design, they might use a space-themed or futuristic set and background and write an essay on how it relates to the source material.

Students in this competition need to put in a lot of time and effort if they want to see success. The show that is chosen for theatrical design is announced at the State Meet the prior year so that students have almost nine months to work on and perfect their designs. The designs are usually due in February so that students have time to review and address criticisms of their work to potentially qualify for the State Meet in May.

In each category, no more than twenty people qualified to State in their conference while in others, only six teams qualified. So, if you know anyone who has qualified for the State Meet in Theatrical Design, give them a big congratulations! It's an honor to be recognized at the State Contest. From Texas Thespians, *Break a Leg* to State Qualifiers!

Are you working too hard?

Have you tried to squeeze one more rehearsal in an already packed week?

We have all been there, but you might be surprised to find out that
you could be overworking yourself and your students.

How Equity Hours Work

In "rehearsal only" weeks:

- During Non-Performance Weeks, small cast shows (14 or less) the work-week is 48 hours long, with no more than 45 hours allotted for rehearsal.
- During Non-Performance Weeks, large cast shows (15 or more) the work-week is 50 hours long, with no more than 47 hours allotted for rehearsal.
- 12-hour span for the work day with a 12-hour break in between
- You will hear 7 out of 9 or 8 out of 10 or 10 out of 12.
 An 8 out of 10 assumes a 2-hour break, etc.
- Breaks: 5 minutes after 55 minutes or 10 minutes after 80 minutes.
- You get a 11/2 hours for meals after 5 hours.

In "tech weeks":

- During the seven days leading up to the first public performance (preview), the work week is 52 hours long, with all 52 hours available for rehearsal.
- Two 10 out of 12 daus
 - -no more than 2 of these a week
 - -20 day gap between 10 out of 12 calls
 - -no 2 performance days after these calls
- Breaks: 11/2 hours

In "performance/rehearsal" weeks:

- During a week that is both rehearsal and performance, the work-week is 50 hours long, with all 50 hours available for rehearsal or performance. (This applies to previews, as well as rollover situations.)
- 50 hours includes everything
- No more than 10 hours of rehearsal in the first week
- 8 performances a week
 - -2 weeks' notice for changes
 - -2 performances per day, no more than 5 in 3 days
 - -2 performances not greater than 9 hours
- Breaks: 5 minutes after 55 minutes, 10 minutes after 80 minutes
- You get 2 hours for meals

- One hour max, which is deducted from the next day's rehearsal.
- · Sealed envelope if posted in a public area
- Available for the first preview
